

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

XXX COMMUNITY COLLEGE

AND

XXX COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS

In a continuing effort to provide career opportunities for secondary school students in the XXXX programs and to transition into postsecondary institutions, XXX Community College agrees to extend at no cost to the student, other than the application for admission fee, certificate hours or college credit according to the following requirements.

I. Articulation with XXX Community College

To articulate technical core courses taken at XXX County Public High Schools to XXX Community College (XXX CC), students must meet the following requirements to earn certificate hours or college credit:

1. Be considered a XXXX student defined as a student in an articulated sequential vocational program of study, which leads to a postsecondary certificate or degree.
2. Pass the specified dual enrollment course(s) identified on the attached course equivalence section with a minimum grade of “C” (unless otherwise noted); OR pass the specified high school course(s) with a minimum grade of “C” AND pass the common assessment or provide proof of state/industry certification. If the student does not have a “C” or better in the course(s), he/she is ineligible for college credit. Requirements for dual enrollment are described in the relevant Inter-Institutional Articulation Agreement between XXX CC and the school district.
3. Pay the College’s Application for Admission Fee.
4. Meet the regular college entrance requirements.
5. Comply with the appropriate placement and course prerequisite requirements of the college.
6. Be enrolled at XXX CC in a XXXX program of study.

7. If the student is enrolled in a Career Academy, the student will complete a work-based learning experience (e.g. co-op, internship, job shadowing, mentoring, clinical), developed with the support of the Academy Program Advisory Committee. Workplace experiences in the Academy program and the XXX CC program into which the student articulates will be coordinated with the assistance of the Advisory Committee(s).
8. Credit earned through XXX CC's Proficiency-Based Examination Program (PEP) is valid for twelve (12) months from date of high school graduation. A maximum of six (6) credits may be earned through PEP.

II. Course Equivalency

1. Secondary and postsecondary faculty committees have compared the technical course competencies to establish their equivalence for the purpose of articulation. Business representatives from program advisory committees have reviewed and approved these course articulations.
2. Students meeting all requirements will receive college credit according to the attached course equivalence list. The following options are available for high school students to earn college credit through this agreement: dual enrollment, credit for state/industry-recognized certifications, or credit by assessment. (Note: Once enrolled at XXX CC, students should explore options for earning additional credits for prior learning, state/industry certification, or work experience. See the section on "Experiential Credit and Credit by Exam" in the XXX CC catalog for more information on credit by certification, credit by assessment, and credit for prior learning or work experience.)

III. Terms of Agreement

This agreement shall be reviewed annually and shall be in effect from the date signed or until either party identifies a need for revision or terminates this agreement within thirty days written notice. Revisions to the course equivalency section may be made with the approval of the President of XXX Community College, and the Superintendent of XXX County Public Schools or his designee.
